## J. SCHERZER HISTORY

The name "Meister Johannes Scherzer" continues a long tradition and is a name found only on the highest quality trumpets made by hand.

Since 1884 Emil Knoth studied and worked in Schöneck/Vogtland with August Richard Penzel. In 1900 he founded the Rino workshop in Markneukirchen. Even before the opening of his own workshop he acquired additional knowledge in the well-known firm August Reichel jun. in Markneukirchen. Emil's son Kurt Knoth then took over and moved the workshop to Mosenstraße 13 where his nephew Johannes Scherzer took over after receiving his master craftsman's certificate in 1951.

The pursuit of excellence continued, when in 1984 the master workshop of Johannes Scherzer was integrated into the state-owned enterprise B&S (Blechblas- und Signalinstrumentenfabrik) and then in 1991 the Vogtländische Musikinstrumentenfabrik. Today it has its home in the Buffet Crampon producing trumpets in tradition and perfection.
